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What is the Tennessee Master Gardener Program?

Certified Master Gardeners and Extension professionals train members of the community to provide sound, practical, research-based information to educate the public about home horticulture.

What is the mission of a Tennessee Master Gardener?

A Tennessee Master Gardener's mission is to promote environmental stewardship and to educate the general public about horticulture using research-based information available through UT Extension.

To become a Master Gardener:

- Complete an application.
- Attend 40 hours of basic horticulture classes.
- Complete volunteer service and continuing education hours to become certified.

The benefits of becoming a Master Gardener include:

- Expanding your gardening skills.
- Sharing your gardening knowledge.
- Being involved in your local community.
- Making a difference in Tennessee.

What are volunteer opportunities?
